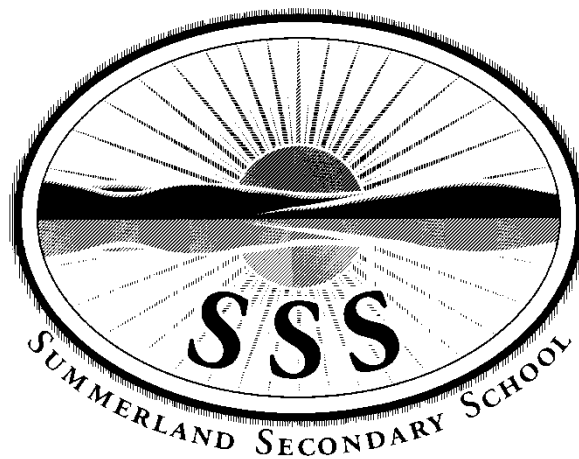

SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES GENERAL INFORMATION

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are based on academic achievement only. Local scholarship winners will be determined and announced at the Graduation Ceremony on June 29, 2018.

BURSARIES

Bursaries are based upon need, achievement, attitude, effort and character. Local bursary winners will be announced at the Graduation Ceremony in June. A Bursary application form is included at the back of this book. Students must **fill out a bursary application form for EACH bursary applied for**. Each bursary application must also include a copy of the student's interim transcript **and** an essay. Students will be informed when their Interim Transcripts will be available for pick up from Student Services in April. **Please ensure you meet the criteria of a specific bursary before you apply for it.**

Many of the scholarships and bursaries are generated through investments of capital bequested to the Summerland and District Educational Funding Foundation. As a result, the amount of the awards may vary from those listed due to fluctuations in interest rates.

Submitting Applications

Assemble and staple each Bursary you are applying for, individually, in this order:

1. Bursary application form
2. Copy of Essay
3. Copy of Special Application form and/or reference letter (only if criteria specifically asks for this)
4. Copy of Interim Transcript

The Bursary Checklist (found at the back of this book) must be completed and returned with your applications. Paragraph portion must be completed. Please arrange all your applications in the same order as they appear on the checklist. The checklist goes on top of your complete package.

LOCAL BURSARIES

Students must fill out **ONE** bursary
application **FOR EACH** award applied for.

APPLE VALLEY CRUISERS BURSARY

A \$500 bursary will be awarded to a student who shows an aptitude and enthusiasm in the field of automotive mechanics. This is available for up to 18 months after graduation and is payable upon submission of proof of registration at a post-secondary institution.

BUD FOREMAN MEMORIAL SENIOR MENS HOCKEY BURSARY

The Summerland Golden Jets will be offering two \$500 bursaries in the memory of Mr. Bud Foreman. This bursary will be awarded to a graduating student who has been playing hockey and will be payable upon submission of proof of registration at a post-secondary institution.

CANADIAN PARENTS FOR FRENCH BURSARY

The Local Chapter of the Canadian Parents for French is offering a \$400 bursary to a graduate of the Summerland Secondary School French Immersion Program. The successful applicant must have completed the French Immersion program and demonstrated excellence in academic achievement, effort and class participation and is planning to continue their post-secondary education in French. Applicants must fill out the regular bursary application form and also submit a cover letter, written in French, explaining what he or she plans to do next year and how they plan to continue using the French language. The cover letter should be addressed to the: CPF Bursary Selection Committee, and should be about one page long. All French Immersion graduates are invited to apply for this bursary.

CANADIAN UNION OF PUBLIC EMPLOYEES (CUPE) LOCAL 1136 BURSARY

(for the children of CUPE Local 1136 District of Summerland Employees)

Every graduating child of a Canadian Union of Public Employees Local No. 1136 (District of Summerland employee) will be eligible to receive a \$1000 bursary by completing the application form. Students will have two years from graduation to enroll full time into a trade school, college or university of their choice. Funds will be disbursed after the proof of enrollment and payment in post-secondary school is provided. A **special application form** is required and may be obtained from the Student Services Office.

CARLA WIERSMA MEMORIAL BURSARY

A \$1,250 bursary will be awarded to a female student who has demonstrated strong academic achievement in Math and is going on to post-secondary studies. This bursary is available for up to 18 months after graduation and is payable upon submission of proof of registration at a post-secondary institution.

CATHERINE JAVORSKI MEMORIAL BURSARY (ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION BRANCH 22)

This bursary is for \$1000. Preference will be given to children or grandchildren of ex-service personnel, however students who do not meet this criteria will also be considered. The recipient must be proceeding to further education at an acceptable educational institution. **Special application forms** are required and may be obtained from the Student Services Office. Selections will be made by a committee of three appointed by Branch 22. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided. This bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

DORA TURNER MEMORIAL BURSARY

This bursary of \$1,600 will be awarded to a student who has demonstrated good moral character and good citizenship. Financial need will also be considered in the selection for this award. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. This bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

DOREEN AND ALISTER MCINTOSH MEMORIAL BURSARY

Five bursaries of \$500 each will be awarded to students whom have achieved grades of a B average, demonstrated community involvement, and will be pursuing post-secondary education, training or an apprenticeship. The bursaries will be available for 18 months after graduation.

DOREEN TAIT MEMORIAL BURSARY

This \$1,400 bursary will be presented to a deserving grade 12 student in memory of Doreen Tait. To be eligible for this award, students must intend to pursue post-secondary education in a Bachelor of Arts or a Bachelor of Fine Arts program. This award will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months after graduation.

DOROTHY RIEDL MEMORIAL BURSARY

(Okanagan Skaha Teachers Union)

One bursary of \$500 will be presented to one grade 12 student. Preference will be given to the children of members of OSTU, and will be attending a post-secondary institution. Financial need will also be considered in the selection for these awards. This award will only be paid out after proof of attendance and proof of payment at a recognized post-secondary institution is provided to the OSTU. These awards must be used within 24 months of graduation.

DULCIE MARJORIE DOELL BURSARY

This bursary of \$800 will be awarded to a student who is planning to continue their education. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

ELLEN LLOYD MEMORIAL BURSARY

Ellen Lloyd was a tireless advocate for the youth of Summerland spearheading such initiatives as the Rotary Youth Unity Retreat, the Man of Steel Triathlon and SADI. To honor her memory, a \$1000 bursary will be awarded each year to a graduating student who personifies the assets and community involvement that Ellen worked to instill in young people. As Ellen was always a champion of the less fortunate, special consideration will be given to students who have had to overcome some personal challenges. Students must be planning on pursuing post-secondary education, in any field, within 18 months following graduation. In addition to the regular application, students are asked to **submit a short paragraph outlining the challenges they have faced in achieving their graduation.**

FAITH REBEKAH LODGE #32 BURSARY

One bursary of \$500 is given to a deserving student who is planning to continue their education. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The bursary is available for 12 months from the presentation date.

FRED KATO BURSARY

This bursary of \$400 will be awarded to a student who is planning to continue their post-secondary education. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

GARY NEIL BLUMHAGEN BURSARY

This award is a minimum of \$300 given in memory of Gary Neil Blumhagen, a 1974 graduate of SSS. Gary's first love was music and he performed locally and throughout the Okanagan. Gary passed away in December of 1988 during a storm off the coast of Vancouver Island. This bursary, in Gary's memory, will be awarded to a deserving Grade 12 student who has maintained at least a B average and plans to pursue an academic or applied post-secondary program in the field of music and/or science. To be eligible, applicants must have demonstrated a sincere work ethic. This bursary will be paid when proof of

registration at a post-secondary institution and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

GEORGE McEACHERN BURSARY
(Royal Canadian Legion Branch 22)

This bursary is for \$1500. Preference will be given to children or grandchildren of ex-service personnel, however students who do not meet this criteria will also be considered. The recipient must be proceeding to further education at an acceptable educational institution. **Special application forms** are required and may be obtained from the Student Services Office. Selections will be made by a committee of three appointed by Branch 22. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The Bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

GEORGE SUTTON ROTARY CLUB BURSARY

One bursary of \$1,500 will be awarded to a student planning to attend a post-secondary institution within a period of 18 months after secondary school graduation. The bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided. The bursary will be awarded to a student who has a record of volunteer work and community involvement, one who has shown a willingness to learn, an eagerness to participate and a desire to contribute to their school and to their community.

GERARD McHALE MEMORIAL BURSARY

A bursary of \$500 will be awarded to a student who is planning to pursue post-secondary training or apprenticeship in a trade. Preference will be given to a student interested in the field of mechanics. This bursary is given in memory of Gerard McHale, a mechanics and metalwork teacher at Summerland Secondary School, who passed away suddenly in September of 2002. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

GLENFIR SCHOOL SOCIETY LEGACY AWARD

This award for \$3000 is to be awarded to an outstanding student and citizen who is proceeding on in any field of study at an accredited post-secondary institution. Achievement in fine arts and/or athletics will be considered as well as academic achievement. The award will be paid after the "Request for Funds" form is submitted, along with the documentation outlined on the form. Documents dated October 1, 2018 or later are acceptable. If no claim is made by Jan 31, 2019, the award may be reassigned to a member of the 2019 graduating class. The recipient must be taking a full course load, i.e. 5 full courses per term.

GLENN BLYSTONE BURSARY

This bursary is a minimum of \$200 offered in memory of Glenn Blystone. It is given to recognize a student who has demonstrated sincere efforts to be a good and caring citizen within the school and the community. Consideration will be given to good character and the dedication of the individual to satisfactorily complete secondary school studies. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

GORDON RITCHIE BURSARY

Two Summerland Secondary School students who have shown leadership, above average academic achievement, and worthy citizenship will receive a prestigious award of a minimum of \$750 each. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

GORDON SMITH ROTARY CLUB BURSARY

One bursary of \$1,500 will be awarded to a student planning to attend a post-secondary institution within a period of 18 months after secondary school graduation. The bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided. The bursary will be awarded to a student who has a record of volunteer work and community involvement, one who has shown a willingness to learn, an eagerness to participate and a desire to contribute to their school and to their community.

GPH MECHANICAL BURSARY

A bursary of \$350 will be awarded to a female student who is planning to pursue post-secondary training/apprenticeship in a trade. Preference will be given to a student interested in the field of mechanics. This bursary will be paid upon receiving proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and will be available for up to 18 months after graduation.

GRAD LEGACY BURSARY

A bursary of \$500 will be awarded to a student who has demonstrated sincere volunteer efforts to contribute to their class' graduation experience, through organizing and participating in fundraising events, volunteering their time for graduation events, or supporting their fellow class members in some way to make their graduation experience positive. This student should have given freely of themselves to support their graduation class, to help make graduation a special, supportive experience for their classmates. Please also explain how the bursary would be used to support post-secondary education endeavors.

HUBERT JAMES GIBBS BURSARY

This bursary of \$600 will be awarded to a student who will be attending university. Financial need will be considered in the selection for this award. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at the university and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

IVAN AND STEVIE ROSS BURSARY

This bursary is offered in memory of Ivan and Stevie Ross. The amount of this bursary will be \$500. It will be presented to a graduating student in need. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

IVY MASON BURSARY

The Ivy Mason Bursary is a minimum of \$250 to be awarded to a leading student of the graduating class who is planning to attend a post-secondary institution. Academic standing will be the primary consideration in the selection of a recipient. Preference will be given to students pursuing studies in linguistics, theatre and/or art. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

JANET RITCHIE BURSARY

The Janet Ritchie Bursary is a minimum of \$800 and will be awarded to a student who has a strong academic record, good moral character and has demonstrated good citizenship. Financial need will also be considered in the selection for this award. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

JEN AND BOB TINGLEY BURSARY - 1987

This bursary is \$500 and will be awarded to a grade 12 graduating student who exhibits by example, good character, academic achievement, an industrious nature and who shows financial need. The bursary will be paid when the recipient provides proof of registration at a post-secondary institution. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

JOSEPH LAMB MEMORIAL BURSARY

This bursary is a minimum of \$250. It will be awarded to a graduating student who demonstrates need, and whose improved achievement and attitude illustrate their belief that continuing education is important. The student MUST, in the last two years of secondary school, have shown a worthwhile effort and attitude towards preparing for a post-secondary education. The bursary is provided in memory of Robert Joseph Lamb, who graduated from Summerland Secondary School in 1991. His commitment to continuing education was unequivocal. He died as a passenger in an alcohol related motor vehicle accident in Summerland, in March of 1993. The bursary will be paid on proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and submission of social insurance number, and will be held for 18 months.

KEN BOOTHE MEMORIAL BURSARY

This bursary is in memory of Ken Boothe, who served the District for many years as a member and chairman of the School Board, and as an Alderman and Mayor of Summerland. The amount of the bursary shall be the amount of the accumulated yearly earnings from the term deposit. The amount will be a minimum of \$250. All students who are planning to attend a post-secondary institution are eligible to apply. Special consideration will be given to students planning to pursue their education in the field of music. This bursary will be paid to the recipient when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number are provided. This bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

KINSMEN CLUB OF SUMMERLAND BURSARY

This is an annual award of \$1,000 presented by the Kinsmen Club to a student going on to any form of post-secondary education. This bursary will be paid to the recipient when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number are provided. This award must be used within 12 months of graduation.

KIWANIS CLUB OF SUMMERLAND BURSARY

The Kiwanis Club of Summerland offers one award of \$1,000 to be presented to students going into a trade or a technical institution. This bursary will be paid to the recipient when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution, social insurance number, and contact phone number are provided. This award must be used within 18 months of graduation.

KIWANIS CLUB OF SUMMERLAND- JOHN TAMBLYN MEMORIAL BURSARY

The Kiwanis Club of Summerland offers one award of \$1,000 to be presented to a student going on to post-secondary studies in the field of education. This bursary will be paid to the recipient when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution, social insurance number and contact phone number are provided. This award must be used within 18 months of graduation.

KYLE MCKENZIE MEMORIAL BURSARY

The bursary is in memory of Kyle McKenzie, a member of the graduation class of 1991, who passed away during his final year at Summerland Senior Secondary School. It will be given to a graduating student pursuing a post-secondary education who expresses their religious faith in their actions of love and concern within the school and community. The recipient of the bursary is to be a respected and admired member of the graduating class. Special consideration will be given to applicants who also have

demonstrated the same characteristics of love and service within their church or religious circles. Academically, the applicant is to be a student who has worked to achieve their fullest potential. This year, the amount is a minimum of \$250. To be considered for this bursary, the student **must supply a letter of recommendation, preferably from the clergy of their congregation, or from an officer of their religious organization.** The recipient must show proof of registration and social insurance number before receiving this bursary. The bursary is available for 18 months from presentation date.

LADIES AUXILIARY TO THE ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION BURSARIES

Three bursaries of \$1,500 are awarded to deserving students who are proceeding to post-secondary education and who will require financial aid. Preference will be given to sons, daughters or grandchildren of veterans, however students who do not meet this criteria will also be considered. **Special application forms are required** and may be obtained from the Student Services office. The award will be given when proof of registration is provided. The bursaries must be used within 18 months of presentation.

LAKESHORE RACQUETS CLUB BURSARY

This bursary, in the amount of \$200 will be awarded to a graduating student who has been an active member (junior or family) of Lakeshore Racquets Club for at least two years and who will be entering full-time post-secondary education (university, college or vocational). The awarding of this bursary will be based on academic achievement, personal development, sportsmanship, mentorship, and need. The award will be given when proof of registration is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

LARK GROUP COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT BURSARY

A \$1000 bursary will be bestowed to a student who contributes to the community by becoming involved in our civic community issues with the goal of making the community better. This student will be engaged in civic affairs by volunteering with the District of Summerland and assisting the Mayor and Council with research and projects.

Alternatively, this student will be involved in social responsibility campaigns to help make the community better, such as anti-bullying campaigns or fundraising for social or health causes, for example. The student also needs to demonstrate financial need.

The bursary will be awarded to a student who is planning to pursue post-secondary training or apprenticeship in a trade. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available 18 months from the presentation date.

LEONA CLAES MEMORIAL MUSIC AWARD

This bursary, in the amount of \$1,000, will be awarded in loving memory of Leona Claes, grandmother of Klara Woldenga, SSS Grad 2008, and Jenna Woldenga, SSS Grad 2012. This bursary is awarded to a graduating student planning to pursue a career in the field of Musical or Stage Arts. Priority will be given to classical voice, instrumental, ballet or stage performers. **Submission in the form of CD/DVD is required as well as a written submission outlining the applicant's career plan.** This Bursary is available for twelve (12) months from presentation date.

MAGDA FENWICK BURSARY

This bursary, in the amount of \$1,200 will be awarded to a grade 12 student who will be pursuing a trade. Preference will be given to a student based on need and aptitude for their chosen vocation. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration is shown. It is available for 12 months from the presentation date.

MINA ELIZABETH MILLIE MEMORIAL BURSARY

A minimum of \$450 is awarded to a graduating student going on to post-secondary education. Special consideration will be given to students who have pride in their community, and who have demonstrated a willingness to be involved in school and community. This bursary will be awarded to a student who indicates a determination to work towards their full potential. The recipient must show proof of registration and social insurance number before receiving this bursary.

OKANAGAN FEST-OF-ALE SOCIETY BURSARY

A \$500 bursary is available to a graduating student who will be continuing on to post-secondary studies in the hospitality industry. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration is shown. It is available for 12 months from the presentation date.

OKANAGAN HINDU TEMPLE AND CULTURE SOCIETY BURSARY

This bursary, in the amount of \$500 will be awarded to a graduating student who will be attending a post-secondary institution. The student must be an honor roll student and have outstanding work habits. Preference will be given to the child of a single parent family. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

OKANAGAN RODTIQUES TECH AWARD

A bursary in the amount of \$500 will be awarded to a student who is planning to pursue post-secondary training in a technical, vocational or an apprenticeship program. It is given to recognize a student who has satisfactorily completed their secondary school studies and demonstrated sincere efforts to be involved in community volunteering. Financial need will also be considered in the selection for this award. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

OKANAGAN SKAHA PRINCIPALS' & VICE PRINCIPALS' ASSOCIATION BURSARY

A bursary of \$1000 will be made available to a graduate from Summerland Secondary School who is planning to take a recognized form of post-secondary education. This bursary will be awarded to a student who demonstrates leadership both in the school and in the community. Special consideration will be given to the son or daughter of a school administrator. If you are eligible for this award, you may also qualify for the regional award. Check in Student Services. Proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is required for the bursary to be paid. This bursary is available for 18 months from the date of presentation.

OKANAGAN SKAHA TEACHERS' UNION EDUCATION AND TECHNICAL BURSARY

Two bursaries in the amount of \$500 each will be awarded to graduates from Summerland Secondary School. Preference will be given to the children of members of OSTU, who will be attending a post-secondary institution (based on overall accomplishment and need). Preference will be given to a student planning on attending a technical, vocational, or fine arts institution. This bursary will only be paid out after proof of attendance and proof of payment at a recognized post-secondary institution is provided to the OSTU and must be used within 24 months of graduation.

ORDER OF THE EASTERN STAR – EDINA CHAPTER #33

A bursary of \$500 is offered to a student to further their education at a university, technical school, or other acceptable educational institution. To be considered, a student should demonstrate good citizenship, character and need in of financial assistance. Proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is required for bursary to be paid. This bursary is available for 12 months after graduation.

PARKDALE PLACE HOUSING SOCIETY BURSARY

A bursary of \$1000 will be awarded to a deserving graduating student who demonstrates a combination of qualities in the areas of academics, social awareness and compassion. Preference will be granted to an individual who shows a sincere dedication to seniors in the community. The bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided. The bursary is available for 12 months from the presentation date.

PAT AND HOWARD JORDAN BURSARY

This bursary of \$300 will be awarded to a student at the School Leaving Ceremonies in June. Consideration will be given to a student planning to continue studies at a recognized university or college or a university transfer program. Applicants must prove need, have above average marks, and have shown good citizenship in the school and community during their secondary school years. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is only available for 18 months from the presentation date.

PAUL AND GOLDIE CHARLES MEMORIAL BURSARY

(Royal Canadian Legion Branch 22)

An annual award of \$1000 is available to a student who is proceeding to further education in an agricultural field. Preference will be given to sons, daughters or grandchildren of veterans, however students who do not meet this criteria will also be considered. Selection will be made by a committee appointed by Branch 22 of the Summerland Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion. **A special application form is required** and may be obtained from the Student Services Office. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

PENNIE JAMIESON MEMORIAL BURSARY

An annual award of \$1000 is available to a deserving Grade 12 student graduate who excels academically in school, actively contributes to making the school and community a better place, and plans to continue his/her studies at a post-secondary institution. The award must be claimed by January 31, 2019.

PENNY LANE – ART SEWELL MEMORIAL BURSARY

This bursary, in the amount of \$500 will be awarded to a grade 12 student who has shown and demonstrated a positive impact on the youth of Summerland. This could be through volunteering, participating, and/or working with or on behalf of our youth. Students applying for this bursary will be **required to provide an essay explaining how they have had a positive impact on youth in our community (max. 500 words), along with the application form.**

Art Sewell was passionate about supporting youth and their connection within the community. He was a founding member of Penny Lane and served as Chairman for 8 years. Art strongly believed that business leaders have a responsibility to provide opportunities for skill development in youth that help them reach their full potential.

The selection committee will be made up of representatives from Penny Lane. The selection committee will consider the merits of the essay, character, attitude and financial need. This bursary will be paid for when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is only available for 18 months from the presentation date.

PENNY LANE – BELA BLYSTONE MEMORIAL BURSARY

This bursary, in the amount of \$500 will be awarded to a grade 12 student who will be pursuing a career in Health Sciences. Students applying for this bursary will be required to provide along with the application form **an essay, max. 500 words, on what specifically in Health Sciences they are pursuing and why.**

Bela Blystone graduated from SSS in 1988. She went on to obtain a Bachelor's of Science degree from OUC, then practical training in massage and certification in reflexology. She moved back to Summerland and started Bela's Reflexology in 1994. Bela's bubbly personality, warm smile and compassionate heart quickly gained her a long list of clients and friends. She was a generous member of the community, volunteering her time, helping anyone in need. Bela died in a tragic car accident on July 23rd, 2010 at the age of 40. It is hoped that this bursary will help continue her legacy and spread her healing touch.

The selection committee will be made up of both Penny Lane and Blystone family representatives. The selection committee will consider work ethic, character, attitude and financial need when choosing a recipient. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is only available for 18 months from the presentation date.

PENTICTON AND DISTRICT COMMUNITY RESOURCES BURSARY

This bursary is for \$1000. The recipient of this bursary must be either a student with a disability taking post-secondary studies *OR* a student who is going into the Human Services field. The bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided.

RALPH MACKENZIE SCOTT BURSARY

A bursary of \$500 will be awarded to a deserving SSS graduate. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

REGISTERED MASSAGE THERAPISTS BURSARY

A bursary of \$240 is being offered by the Summerland Registered Massage Therapists. This bursary will be awarded to a SSS graduate who is planning to pursue any post-graduate training in the health-care field. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION (Branch 22) BURSARIES

There are three awards of \$1,500 each being offered this year (the George McEachern Bursary and two Legion Bursaries). There is also one bursary for \$1000 (the Paul & Goldie Charles Memorial Bursary) being offered. Preference will be given to children or grandchildren of ex-service personnel, however, students who do not meet this criteria will also be considered. The recipients must be proceeding to further education at an acceptable educational institution. **Special application forms** are required and may be obtained from the Student Services Office. Selections will be made by a committee of three appointed by Branch 22. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The Bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

RUTH DALE MEMORIAL BURSARY (1986)

One bursary of a minimum of \$500 will be awarded to a graduating student at the School Leaving Ceremonies in June. The Bursary is given to recognize a student who has demonstrated effort and citizenship toward school and community. Students who have volunteered their time towards various school and community activities are encouraged to apply for this award. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

SAM HANON MEMORIAL BURSARY

One bursary of \$1,500 will be awarded to a graduating student who demonstrates a well-balanced combination of traits in the areas of academics, leadership, school and/or community athletics, social awareness, and peer compassion. This award is presented annually in memory of Sam Hanon who was a grade 12 student at Summerland Secondary School. He was killed in a motor vehicle accident enroute to his Summerland Jets Midget AA hockey game on December 9, 2007. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

This award is by nomination only. Applicants must receive nominations from five members of the graduating class and/or teachers. **A Nomination form** is available at the back of this book.

ST. STEPHENS ANGLICAN CHURCH BURSARIES

St. Stephens Anglican Church is pleased to offer, as part of their outreach to the community of Summerland, two \$500 bursaries to two graduating students planning to pursue post-secondary studies. An applicant must maintain a C+ average or better, be active in community, school and a faith community, have clear goals and a clear career objective and be pursuing a minimum 2 year academic or technical diploma. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a Social Insurance number are shown. The bursary will be available for 24 months from the presentation date.

SUMMERLAND BAPTIST CHURCH BURSARY

This bursary will award \$600 to a student planning to pursue post-secondary education and who has demonstrated care and concern for others in the community. Students who have volunteered their time towards various school and community activities are encouraged to apply for this award. This bursary is NOT RESTRICTED TO, nor specially provided for student members of Summerland Baptist Church. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary will be available for 18 months from the presentation date.

SUMMERLAND CHAMBER OF COMMERCE BURSARY

This bursary of \$500 will be offered to a SSS graduate who is pursuing post-secondary education in business entrepreneurship. The bursary will be paid by the donor when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided and must be claimed in the same calendar year, by December 15, 2018.

SUMMERLAND COMMUNITY ARTS COUNCIL BURSARY

Applicants for this \$500 bursary must be resident of the community for at least one year. This bursary is available to a graduating high school student pursuing a fine arts education. The Committee will consider extreme cases of need. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary will be available for 18 months from the presentation date.

SUMMERLAND HEALTH-CARE AUXILIARY BURSARIES

Four \$3000 bursaries will be offered to graduates who are enrolling in any post-graduate training connected in the health-care field and must have proof of given volunteer hours (preferably in health care). The award will be given when proof of registration and social insurance number is provided. This bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

SUMMERLAND HEALTH-CARE AUXILIARY ENDOWMENT BURSARY

There will be one \$3000 bursary offered to graduates who are enrolling in any post-graduate training connected in the health-care field and must have proof of given volunteer hours (preferably in health care). The award will be given when proof of registration and social insurance number is provided. This bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

SUMMERLAND MINISTERIAL BURSARY

A bursary of \$1000 will be awarded to a graduating student who demonstrates financial need as well as evidence of giving back to their school and the community of Summerland through volunteer work, and is going on to post-secondary studies. This bursary is available for up to 18 months after graduation and is payable upon submission of proof of registration at a post-secondary institution.

SUMMERLAND MINOR FASTBALL ASSOCIATION BURSARY

The Summerland Minor Fastball Association will be awarding a \$200.00 bursary to a grade 12 student who is registered in Summerland Minor Fastball and is continuing on to post-secondary school.

SUMMERLAND SPORTSMEN'S ASSOCIATION BURSARY

A bursary of \$1,000 will be awarded to a student who is proceeding to post-secondary education. This award will be given to those individuals who are pursuing studies in wildlife management, the environment or related areas. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided and will be awarded at the start of year one of the recipient's program. The bursary is only available for 18 months from the presentation date.

SUMMERLAND TIMBERMART BURSARY

One bursary of \$500 will be awarded to a graduating student who is planning to pursue post-secondary education in the areas of Business Management, Forestry Management or a Building Trade. The selection committee will consider work ethic, character, citizenship, attitude and need in choosing a recipient. The full bursary amount will be paid by the donor when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided. This bursary is available for 18 months from the date of presentation.

SUMMERLAND WOMEN'S FITNESS BURSARY IN MEMORY OF ETHEL SMITH

This bursary of \$500 will be awarded to a female student who is planning to continue with a post-secondary education. Preference will be given to students planning to pursue a career in the Health and Wellness field. Financial need will also be considered in the selection of this award. The award will be given when proof of registration and social insurance number is provided. This bursary is available for 18 months from the date of presentation.

SUMMERLAND WOMEN'S INSTITUTE BURSARY

This bursary of \$600 is offered by the Summerland Women's Institute. It will be presented to a Summerland Secondary School graduate who is planning to proceed to university, technical school, or other acceptable post-graduate educational institution. The awarding of this bursary will be based on academic achievement, citizenship, and need. The award will be given when proof of registration and social insurance number is provided. This bursary is available for 18 months from the presentation date.

SUMMERLAND YACHT CLUB BURSARY

A \$1000 bursary is offered by the Summerland Yacht Club to a graduating student who plans on pursuing post-secondary studies at a college, technical school or trades program. Students should have shown good effort and attendance during their high school years. Primary consideration will be given to students with financial need. DR. DENIS BROWN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

A scholarship will be available to a graduating student. The award will be based on academic merit and awarded to a student with interest in science and/or an interest in pursuing a career in science, research, medicine or a related field.

The scholarship will be available for up to 18 months after graduation and will be paid upon proof of registration.

FUDGE SCHOLARSHIP

A scholarship in memory of Barbara Fudge will be available to a graduating student. The award will be based on academic merit and awarded to a student with a strong work ethic and who has demonstrated commitment to their community contributions.

The scholarship will be available for up to 18 months after graduation and will be paid upon proof of registration.

IRIS ALBERTA MARIE CLAPPERTON & JOHN KITCHENER SCHOLARSHIPS

Three scholarships will be awarded to students who will be furthering their education.

The scholarship will be paid when proof of registration at an institution is shown and social insurance number is provided. The scholarship is only available for 18 months from the presentation date.

JANET RITCHIE AWARD OF EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP (1989)

This scholarship is given to a top academic student who has demonstrated good citizenship and moral character, has been actively involved in school and community activities, and has an excellent school attendance record.

This scholarship will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The scholarship is only available for 18 months from the presentation date.

KINSMEN CLUB OF SUMMERLAND SCHOLARSHIP

This award is presented by the Kinsmen Club to a student going on to any form of post-secondary education. The scholarship will be paid when proof of registration at an institution is shown and social insurance number is provided. The scholarship is available for 12 months after graduation.

SUMMERLAND SCHOLARSHIP

The Summerland Scholarship, the first scholastic award to be given at the Summerland Secondary School and administered by the Municipality of Summerland, has been presented annually since 1946. The scholarship is presented to a leading student of the graduating class, providing he, or she, has the necessary academic standing and is planning to attend a B.C. university or a university transfer credit course at a B.C. community college the following year.

VERRIER AWARD AND MATSU MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Verrier Award is presented annually to the top ALL-ROUND student in the graduating class. Robert Verrier was killed in a hunting mishap in December 1939. The Verrier trophy was purchased by the Student Council in June, 1941 and was presented that same month, in memory of Robert Verrier. In addition to the trophy, the recipient will also receive a watch.

The following attributes are to be considered when choosing the winner: scholastic, athletic, citizenship/service, social.

The Matsu Memorial Scholarship is provided by Dr. and Mrs. Eddie Matsu in honor of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Matsu. Eddie Matsu was a graduate of Summerland Secondary School and currently is a prominent orthopedic surgeon in Houston, Texas. This scholarship will be awarded to the recipient of the Verrier Award. The scholarship will be paid when proof of registration at an institution is shown and social insurance number is provided.

DISTRICT/AUTHORITY SCHOLARSHIPS

District/Authority Scholarships Program Information for Students

The District/Authority Scholarships recognize graduating BC students for excellence in their chosen area of interest or strength. Winners receive a \$1250 scholarship voucher to use towards their post-secondary tuition.

Basic Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for the District/Authority Scholarship, you:

- Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant) at the time of registration in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded.
- Must be a B.C. resident.
- Must be or have been in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded:
 - Enrolled in a British Columbia public school (including Distributed Learning schools), or
 - Enrolled in a Group 1,2, or 4 British Columbia Independent School, or
 - Enrolled in a Continuing Education Centre, or
 - Registered with a public, independent, francophone or distributed learning school in B.C. as a homeschooled child.

- Meet criteria determined by the local scholarship committee, which requires a student to demonstrate outstanding achievement in any of the following focus areas:
 - **Indigenous Languages and Culture**, (demonstrated at school or in the community)
 - **Fine Arts** (Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)
 - **Applied Design, Skills and Technologies** (Business, Technology, Home Economics, Information Communication Technology)
 - **Physical Activity** (Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical Education)
 - **International Languages** (International Languages Curriculum or External Assessments, including AP and IB courses)
 - **Community Service (Volunteer Activity)**, (includes awareness of local, global and cultural issues)
 - **Technical and Trades Training** (Automotive, Robotics, Coding, Woodwork, Culinary Arts)

- Fulfill the BC Graduation requirements of either the 2004 Graduation Program or the Adult Graduation Program by August 31st of the student's graduating year
