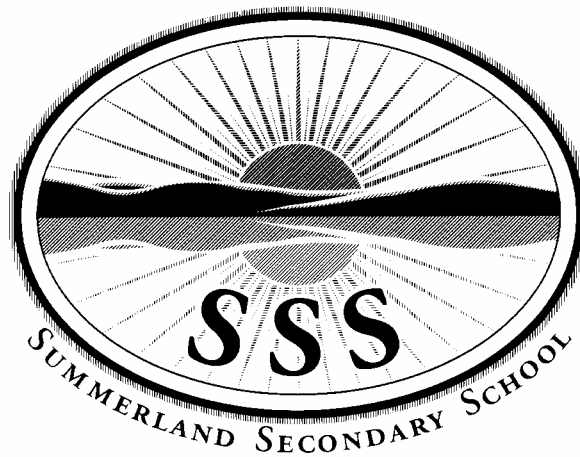

## SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES GENERAL INFORMATION

### DEFINITIONS

- A. **SCHOLARSHIPS** – One application form covers ALL scholarships. Scholarships are based on Academic achievement only. Local scholarship winners will be announced at the School Leaving Exercises in June. A Scholarship application is included at the back of this book. To be considered for all local scholarships, students fill out ONE scholarship application only, which covers all scholarships.
- B. **BURSARIES** - Bursaries are based upon need, achievement, attitude, effort and character. Local bursary winners will be announced at the School Leaving Exercises in June. A Bursary application form is included at the back of this book. Students must fill out a bursary application FOR EACH award applied for. Application forms must be STAPLED TO THE TOP of the application information, do not fold the applications. IT IS REQUESTED THAT ENVELOPES NOT BE USED. However, if the student wishes an envelope, it must measure 8 ½" x 11" with the student's name and the bursary name on each envelope. \*\*PLEASE SUBMIT THE APPLICATIONS IN THE SAME ORDER AS LISTED IN THE BOOK.

**PHOTOCOPYING** will be available to students for \$.05 per page. The **deadline** for copying is Wednesday, April 20<sup>th</sup>.

Many of the scholarships and bursaries are generated through investments of capital bequested to the Summerland and District Educational Funding Foundation. As a result, the amount of the awards may vary from those listed due to fluctuations in interest rates.

# I. LOCAL BURSARIES

Students must fill out ONE bursary  
application FOR EACH award applied for.

Anne Lusted Memorial BURSARY

This \$500 bursary will be presented to a student who meets the following criteria:

- Enrolled in a music class at Summerland Secondary School;
- Plans to pursue a career in music;
- Achieving a minimum grade average of 73%;
- Includes a letter outlining past accomplishments and career goals.

The award must be used within eighteen (18) months of graduation.

### Cliff Mercer Memorial BURSARY

Two \$500 bursaries will be awarded to a student who shows financial need and has demonstrated good effort throughout their high school career. Preference will be given to a student planning on entering a college, trade or technical school, or a private institution. This bursary may be used up to 18 months after graduation and is payable upon submission of proof of registration.

### C.U.P.E. Local 1136 (Corporation of Summerland) BURSARY

*Preference is given if your parent(s) work for the Corporation of Summerland.*

The Canadian Union of Public Employees (Corporation of Summerland), Local 1136, will present one bursary of \$750.00 to a student planning to continue their education at a post secondary institution. Preference will be given to the **son or daughter of a CUPE Local 1136 (Corporation of Summerland) member. Please use the special application form from the Student Services office. Applications not using the special CUPE form will NOT be accepted.**

The award must be used within eighteen (18) months of graduation.

### C.U.P.E. Local 523 (School District #67, Okanagan Skaha) BURSARIES

*Apply for this if your parent(s) are CUPE 523 Okanagan Skaha members.*

**Two (2) bursaries of five hundred (\$500) dollars each will be awarded to the son or daughter of a member in good standing of CUPE 523 Okanagan Skaha. Members work at School District No. 67 as Certified Education Assistants, Bus Drivers, Strong Start Workers, Noon Hour Supervisors, Clerical Workers, Custodians and Maintenance Workers.**

**Bursaries will be awarded to students accepted into the next session of a full-time post-secondary program.**

**Applicants must complete the CUPE 523 Okanagan Skaha bursary application form available from student services and provide requested documentation by the deadline date and time specified to be eligible.**

**Bursary funds will be released upon receipt of proof of payment for courses and after the program withdrawal date.**

### **DORA TURNER MEMORIAL BURSARY**

This bursary of \$1,600.00 will be awarded to a student who has **demonstrated good moral character and good citizenship**. Financial need will also be considered in the selection for this award.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number are shown. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **DOREEN TAIT MEMORIAL BURSARY**

This \$1,400.00 bursary will be presented to a deserving grade 12 student in memory of Doreen Tait. To be eligible for this award, students must intend on pursuing post-secondary work in a Bachelor of Arts program or a Fine Arts program.

This award will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months after graduation.

### **DOROTHY RIEDL MEMORIAL BURSARIES (Okanagan Skaha Teachers Union)**

These two bursaries of \$300.00 each are citizenship awards presented to two grade 12 students who qualify, preference will be given to the children of members of OSTU, and will be attending a post-secondary institution. Financial need will also be considered in the selection for these awards.

These awards will only be paid out after proof of attendance and proof of payment at a recognized post secondary institution is provided to the OSTU. These awards must be used within two years of graduation.

### **DULCIE MARJORIE DOELL BURSARY**

This bursary of \$800.00 will be awarded to a student who is planning to continue their education.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **ELEANOR KNORR BURSARY**

This \$250.00 award will be presented to a deserving grade 12 student in the memory of Eleanor Knorr. Preference may be given to a student who is entering a trade or technical area.

This award will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number are provided. The bursary is only available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **EMIL SORGE CAPITAL MARKETS BURSARY**

One Bursary of \$700 is given to a student with strong academic performance who demonstrates a clear interest in the financial markets. The successful candidate must be applying to a well-established science, applied science or business faculty. A very brief letter articulating the candidate's interest in the financial markets, while not compulsory, is welcome.

This award will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number are provided. The bursary is only available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **FAITH REBEKAH LODGE #32 BURSARY**

One bursary of \$500.00 is given to a deserving student who is planning to continue their education. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The bursary is available for twelve (12) months from the presentation date.

### **FORTISBC BURSARY**

One bursary of \$500.00 will be given by FORTISBC to students of the graduating class. \$500.00 will be awarded to a student with the highest overall GPA who will be entering a post secondary program to pursue on of the following fields:

**-Apprentice Powerline Technology – Apprentice Electrician – Apprentice Millwright – Power Engineering Technology – Electrical Engineering – Electrical Technology – Electronic Technology.**

This award will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number are provided. The award is only available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **FRED KATO BURSARY**

This bursary of \$400.00 will be awarded to a student who is planning to continue their education.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **GARY NEIL BLUMHAGEN BURSARY**

This award is a minimum of \$300.00 given in memory of Gary Neil Blumhagen, a 1974 graduate of S.S.S. Gary's first love was music and he performed locally and throughout the Okanagan. Gary passed away in December 1988 during a storm off the Coast of Vancouver Island. This bursary, in Gary's memory, will be awarded to a deserving Grade 12 student who has maintained at least a B average, and plans to pursue an academic or applied post-secondary programme in the field of **music and/or science**. To be eligible, applicants must have demonstrated a sincere work ethic.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **GERARD McHALE MEMORIAL BURSARY**

A bursary of \$500.00 will be awarded to a student who is planning to pursue post-secondary training or apprenticeship in a trade. Preference will be given to a student interested in the field of mechanics.

This bursary is given in memory of Gerard McHale, a mechanics and metalwork teacher at Summerland Secondary School, who was the head of the Industrial Education Dept. who passed away in September, 2002.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **GLENN BLYSTONE BURSARY**

This bursary is a minimum of \$200.00 offered in memory of Glenn Blystone. It is given to recognize a student who has demonstrated **sincere efforts to be a good and caring citizen** within the school and the community. Consideration will be given to a good character and the dedication of the individual to satisfactorily complete secondary school studies.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **GORDIE DUNCAN MEMORIAL AWARD**

\$1,000 will be awarded to a student proceeding on to Trinity Western University. This award is open to students from Summerland Secondary School, Princess Margaret Secondary School and Penticton Secondary School.

### GORDON RITCHIE BURSARIES

Two Summerland Secondary School students who have shown **leadership, above average academic achievement, and worthy citizenship** will receive a prestigious award of a minimum of \$750.00 each.

Proof of registration must be shown to receive these bursaries.

### GORDON SMITH ROTARY CLUB BURSARY

One bursary of \$2000.00 payable in two installments of \$1000.00 per year for each of the first two years will be awarded to a student planning to attend a tertiary institution within a period of eighteen months after secondary school graduation. The bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided for each of the first and second year. The first payment of the bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date. The second installment is available for twelve (12) months after the first payment and after confirmation of successful completion of the first year.

The bursary will be awarded to a student who has a record of **volunteer work and community involvement**, one who has shown a willingness to learn, an eagerness to participate and a desire to contribute to their school and to their community.

### GRAD 1998 BURSARY

One bursary of \$300 will be awarded to a student, who will be pursuing post-secondary studies. This award is given on behalf of the Grads of 1998.

This award will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number are provided. The bursary is only available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### HUBERT JAMES GIBBS BURSARY

This bursary of \$600.00 will be awarded to a **female student** who will be attending a university. Financial need will be considered in the selection for this award.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at the university and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### I.O.D.E. – KETTLE VALLEY CHAPTER BURSARY

If you are eligible for this IODE award, you may also qualify for one of the provincial awards. Check in Student Services.

This bursary in the amount of \$500.00 will be presented to a grade twelve student who will be enrolling in post graduate training in the **social work field or an arts program**. The bursary will be paid upon proof of registration at a post secondary institution and will be available for eighteen (18) months from the date of presentation.

#### **IVAN and STEVIE ROSS BURSARY**

This bursary is offered in memory of Ivan and Stevie Ross. It will be presented to a graduating student who intends to pursue a career in **Literature, Creative Writing or Journalism**. The amount of this bursary will be a minimum of \$500.00. Consideration will be given to good character and the dedication of the individual to further education.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a social insurance number are provided. The bursary is only available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

#### **IVY MASON BURSARY**

The Ivy Mason Bursary is a minimum of \$250.00 to be awarded to a leading student of the graduating class who is planning to attend a post-secondary institution. **Academic standing** will be the primary consideration in the selection of a recipient. Preference will be given to students pursuing studies in **linguistics/theatre/art**.

#### **JANET RITCHIE BURSARY**

The Janet Ritchie Bursary is a minimum of \$800.00, and will be awarded to a student who has a **strong academic record, good moral character, and has demonstrated good citizenship**. Financial need will also be considered in the selection for this award.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number are provided. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

#### **JEN AND BOB TINGLEY BURSARY - 1987**

\$500.00 will be awarded to a grade 12 graduating student who **exhibits by example, good character, academic achievement, an industrious nature and who shows financial need**. The bursary will be paid when the recipient provides proof of registration at a post-secondary institution

### JOSEPH LAMB MEMORIAL BURSARY

This bursary is a minimum of \$250.00. It will be awarded to a graduating student who demonstrates need, and whose improved achievement and attitude illustrate their belief that continuing education is important. The student **MUST**, in the last two years of secondary school, have shown a worthwhile effort and attitude towards preparing for a post secondary education. A committee of three, including a member of the Lamb family, the principal of the school and a teacher will review applications.

The bursary will be paid on proof of registration at a post secondary institution and submission of social insurance number, and will be held for eighteen (18) months.

The bursary is provided in memory of Robert Joseph Lamb, who graduated from Summerland Secondary School in 1991. His commitment to continuing education was unequivocal. He died as a passenger in an alcohol related motor vehicle accident in Summerland, in March, 1993.

### KAREN LAIDMAN MEMORIAL BURSARY

An award of \$600 is available to a graduating student who will be pursuing post-secondary studies in the field of business, office management or secretarial work. Applicants must show good character, academic achievement, an industrious nature and a love of life. Special consideration will be given to students who have financial need or who have overcome a particular hardship in their lives.

This bursary will be paid on proof of registration at a post secondary institution and submission of social insurance number, and will be available for 18 months following graduation.

### KEN BOOTHE MEMORIAL BURSARY

This bursary is in memory of Ken Boothe, who served the District for many years as a member and chairman of the School Board, and as an Alderman and Mayor of Summerland. The amount of the bursary shall be the amount of the accumulated yearly earnings from the term deposit. The amount will be a minimum of \$250.00.

All students who are planning to attend a post-secondary institution are eligible to apply. Special consideration will be given to students planning to pursue their education in the field of **music**.

This bursary will be paid to the recipient when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number are provided. This bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### KINSMEN CLUB OF SUMMERLAND BURSARY

This is an annual award of \$1,000.00 presented by the Kinsmen Club to a student going on to **any form of post secondary education**. \$500.00 is forwarded when the student registers and the remaining \$500.00 is paid during the second term.

### KIWANIS CLUB OF SUMMERLAND BURSARIES

The Kiwanis Club of Summerland offers two awards of \$1,000.00 each to be presented to students planning to further their education. These awards must be used within eighteen (18) months of graduation.

### KYLE MCKENZIE MEMORIAL BURSARY

The bursary is in memory of Kyle McKenzie, a member of the graduation class of 1991, who passed away during his final year at Summerland Senior Secondary School. It will be given to a graduating student pursuing a post-secondary education who expresses their **religious faith in their actions of love and concern within the school and community**. The recipient of the bursary is to be a respected and admired member of the graduating class. Special consideration will be given to applicants who also have demonstrated the same characteristics of love and service within their church or religious circles. Academically, the applicant is to be a student who has worked to achieve their fullest potential.

This year, the amount is a minimum of \$250.00. To be considered for this bursary, the student must:

1. Make a written application on the general school bursary application form.
2. Supply a letter of recommendation, preferably from the clergy of their congregation, or from an officer of their religious organization.

The recipient must show proof of registration and social insurance number before receiving this bursary. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from presentation date.

### LADIES AUXILIARY TO THE ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION BURSARIES

Two bursaries of \$1,000.00 are awarded to deserving students who are proceeding to post-secondary education and who will require financial aid. Preference will be given to sons, daughters or grandchildren of veterans. **Special application forms are required** and may be obtained from the Student Services office. These bursaries must be used within eighteen (18) months of presentation.

### MAGDA FENWICK BURSARY

This bursary, in the amount of \$1,200.00, will be awarded to a grade 12 student who will be pursuing a trade. Preference will be given to a student based on need and aptitude for their chosen vocation.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration is shown. It is available for twelve (12) months from the presentation date.

### MANDERS MEMORIAL BURSARY

A bursary of \$1,500.00 will be awarded to a student entering first year **Science or Applied Science** at **UBC, SFU, UBC Okanagan or U.Vic.**

This bursary will be awarded to a student who has shown academic excellence, good character, citizenship and dedication to the satisfactory completion of secondary school studies.

### MINA ELIZABETH MILLIE MEMORIAL BURSARY

A minimum of \$450.00 is awarded to a graduating student going on to post-secondary education. The bursary will be paid on receipt of proof of registration at a tertiary education institute and social insurance number.

Special consideration will be given to students who have **pride in their community**, and who have demonstrated a willingness to be involved in school and community. This bursary will be awarded to a student who indicates a determination to work towards their full potential.

### OKANAGAN FEST-OF-ALE SOCIETY BURSARY


A \$500.00 bursary is available to a graduating student who will be continuing on to post-secondary studies in the hospitality industry.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration is shown. It is available for twelve (12) months from the presentation date.

### OKANAGAN HINDU TEMPLE AND CULTURE SOCIETY BURSARY

This bursary, in the amount of \$500.00, will be awarded to a graduating student who will be attending a post-secondary institution. The student must be an honor roll student and have outstanding work habits. Preference will be given to the child of a single parent family.

### OKANAGAN SKAHA PRINCIPALS' & VICE PRINCIPALS' ASSOCIATION BURSARY



If you are eligible for this award, you may also qualify for the regional award. Check in Student Services.

A bursary of \$1000.00 will be made available to a graduate from Summerland Secondary School who is planning to take a recognized form of post-secondary education. This bursary will be awarded to a student who demonstrates **leadership** both in the school and in the community. Special consideration will be given to the son or daughter of a school administrator.

Proof of registration at a post secondary institution is required for the bursary to be paid. This bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the date of presentation.

### **OKANAGAN SKAHA TEACHERS' UNION TECHNICAL BURSARIES**

Two bursaries, in the amount of \$700.00 each, will be awarded to two grade 12 students who qualify, preference will be given to the children of members of OSTU, who will be attending a post-secondary institution (based on overall accomplishment and need). Preference will be given to at least one of these bursaries being awarded to a student planning on attending a technical, vocational, or fine arts institution.

These bursaries will only be paid out after proof of attendance and proof of payment at a recognized post secondary institution is provided to the OSTU and must be used within two years of graduation.

### **ORDER OF THE EASTERN STAR – Edina Chapter #33**

A bursary of \$500.00 is offered to a student to further their education at a university, technical school, or other acceptable educational institution. To be considered, a student should demonstrate good citizenship, character and need. Applicants will be required to **submit 2 letters of reference and a resume** with their completed application.

Proof of registration at a post secondary institution is required for bursary to be paid. This bursary is available for twelve (12) months from the date of presentation.

### **PAT AND HOWARD JORDAN BURSARY**

This bursary of \$300.00 will be awarded to a student at the School Leaving Ceremonies in June. Consideration will be given to a student planning to continue studies at a recognized University or College on a university transfer programme. Applicants must prove need, have above average marks, and have shown good citizenship in the school and community during their secondary school years.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number are provided. The bursary is only available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **PAUL AND GOLDIE CHARLES MEMORIAL BURSARY**

An annual award of \$1000 is available to a student who is proceeding to further education in an **agricultural** field.

Selection will be made by a committee appointed by Branch 22 of the Summerland Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion. A **special application form is required** and may be obtained from the Student Services office.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **PENNIE JAMIESON MEMORIAL BURSARY**

An Annual award of \$1,000 is available to a deserving Grade 12 student graduate who best meets the following criteria:

- Excels academically in school
- Actively contributes to making the school and community a better place, and
- Plans to continue his/her studies at a post-secondary institution.

### **PENNY LANE – ART SEWELL MEMORIAL BURSARY**

This bursary, in the amount of \$500 will be awarded to a grade 12 student who has shown and demonstrated a positive impact on the youth of Summerland. This could be through volunteering, participating, and/or working with or on behalf of our youth. Students applying for this bursary will be required to provide an essay explaining how they have had a positive impact on youth in our community (max. 500 words), along with the application form

Art Sewell was passionate about supporting youth and their connection within the community. He was a founding member of Penny Lane and served as Chairman for 8 years. Art strongly believed that business leaders have a responsibility to provide opportunities for skill development in youth that help them reach their full potential.

The selection committee will be made up of representatives from Penny Lane. The selection committee will consider the merits of the essay, character, attitude and financial need.

This bursary will be paid for when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is only available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **PENNY LANE – BELA MEMORIAL BURSARY**

This bursary, in the amount of \$500 will be awarded to a grade 12 student who will be pursuing a career in Health Sciences. Students applying for this bursary will be required to provide along with the application form an essay, max. 500 words, on what specifically in Health Sciences they are pursuing and why.

Bela Blystone graduated from SSS in 1988. She went on to obtain a Bachelor's of Science degree from OUC, then practical training in massage and certification in reflexology. She moved back to Summerland and started Bela's Reflexology in 1994. Bela's bubbly personality, warm smile and compassionate heart quickly gained her a long list of clients and friends. She was a generous member of the community, volunteering her time, helping anyone in need. Bela died in a tragic car accident on July 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2010 at the age of 40. It is hoped that this bursary will help continue her legacy and spread her healing touch.

The selection committee will be made up of both Penny Lane and Blystone family representatives. The selection committee will consider work ethic, character, attitude and financial need when choosing a recipient.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is only available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **RALPH MACKENZIE SCOTT BURSARY**

A bursary of \$500 will be awarded to a deserving SSS graduate. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **REGISTERED MASSAGE THERAPISTS BURSARY**

A bursary of \$300.00 is being offered by the Summerland RMT's. This bursary will be awarded to a SSS graduate who is planning to pursue any post-graduate training in the **health-care field**.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### **ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION (Branch 22) BURSARIES**

There are four annual awards of \$1,500.00 each. Preference will be given to **children or grandchildren of ex-service personnel**. The recipients must be proceeding to further education at an acceptable educational institution. **Special application forms are required and may be obtained from the Student Services office**. Selections will be made by a committee of three appointed by Branch 22. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is shown. The Bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

#### **RUTH DALE MEMORIAL BURSARY (1986)**

One bursary of a minimum of \$500.00 will be awarded to a graduating student at the School Leaving Ceremonies in June. The Bursary is given to recognize a student who has demonstrated effort and citizenship toward school and community. Students who have volunteered their time towards various school and community activities are encouraged to apply for this award.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

#### **SAM HANON MEMORIAL BURSARY**

This award is presented annually in memory of Sam Hanon who was a grade 12 student at Summerland Secondary School. He was killed in a motor vehicle accident enroute to his Summerland Jets Midget AA hockey game December 9, 2007.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

This award is by nomination only, must receive nomination from five members of the graduating class or teachers. Nomination form is available at the back of this book.

#### **SOUTH OKANAGAN SIMILKAMEEN ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION**

This bursary of up to \$250 will be given to a deserving athlete in the Summerland Secondary School graduating class, in the SOSAA, who has demonstrated leadership and citizenship. This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a Social Insurance number are shown.

#### **ST. STEPHENS ANGLICAN CHURCH BURSARIES**

St. Stephens Anglican Church is pleased to offer, as part of their outreach to the community of Summerland, one \$500.00 bursary to a graduating student planning to pursue post-secondary studies. An applicant must maintain a C+ average or better, be active in community, school and a faith community, have clear goals and a clear career objective and be pursuing a minimum 2 year academic or technical diploma.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and a Social Insurance number are shown. **The bursary must be used in the fall following graduation.**

### SUMMERLAND BAPTIST CHURCH BURSARY

This bursary will award \$500.00 to a student planning to pursue post secondary education and who has demonstrated care and concern for others in the community. Students who have volunteered their time towards various school and community activities are encouraged to apply for this award.

This bursary is **NOT RESTRICTED TO**, nor specially provided for student members of Summerland Baptist Church.

This bursary will be paid when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution and social insurance number is provided. The bursary will be available for eighteen (18) months from the presentation date.

### SUMMERLAND BUILDERS MART BURSARY

One bursary of \$500.00 will be awarded to a graduating student who is planning to pursue further education at a recognized institution in the areas of **Business Management, Forestry Management or Building Trade related to vocational training.**

The selection committee will consider work ethic, character, citizenship, attitude and need in choosing a recipient.

Students applying for this bursary should complete the Summerland Secondary School application form. The full bursary amount will be paid by the donor when proof of registration at a post-secondary institution is provided. This bursary is available for eighteen (18) months from the date of presentation.

### SUMMERLAND COMMUNITY ARTS COUNCIL BURSARY

1. Applicant must be resident of the community for at least one year.
2. Bursary available to graduating High School student pursuing a **fine arts** education.
3. Applicant must provide 2 references.
4. Amount to be \$1,000.00 (\$500 to be awarded at the start of year one of their post-secondary fine arts program and \$500 to be awarded at the start of year two)
5. Committee will consider extreme cases of need.

## SUMMERLAND AND DISTRICT CREDIT UNION BURSARIES

The Summerland & District Credit Union was conceived and built by community members who had a vision of a better future. It is now a strong community owned financial institution. The bursaries are given in honor of those pioneers.

Five bursaries of \$1,000.00 each are offered to Credit Union members for use in furthering their education at a university, technical school, or other acceptable educational institution. ### MATSU MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

**By NOMINATION only:** The Matsu Memorial Scholarship is provided by Dr. and Mrs. Eddie Matsu in honor of his parents, Mr. & Mrs. Arthur Matsu. Eddie Matsu was a graduate of Summerland Secondary School and currently is a prominent orthopedic surgeon in Houston, Texas.

The Scholarship is to be presented yearly to the recipient of the Verrier Award - the **top ALL ROUND student** in the graduating class. It is to be used for post-secondary educational purposes. The amount of the scholarship will be a minimum of \$1,500.00. **PLEASE NOTE:** The Verrier Award/Matsu Scholarship is by nomination only. Nomination forms are available at the back of this book.

## OKANAGAN SKAHA TEACHERS' UNION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.00 will be awarded to a student who qualifies, preference will be given to the children of members of OSTU.

This scholarship will only be paid out after proof of attendance and proof of payment at a recognized post secondary institution is provided to the OSTU. All scholarships, bursaries and awards must be used within two years of graduation.

## PENTICTON MEDICAL SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP

A \$1500 scholarship will be available to a graduating student. The award will be based on academic merit and awarded to a student with interest in science and/or an interest in pursuing a career in science, research, medicine or a related field.

The scholarship will be available for up to 18 months after graduation and will be paid upon proof of registration.

## SUMMERLAND SCHOLARSHIP

The trophy was purchased by the Student Council in June, 1941 and was presented that same month, in memory of Robert Verrier. Robert Verrier was killed in a hunting mishap in December 1939.

In addition to the trophy, the Student Council awards a watch to the winner.

Student must be nominated by five members of the graduating class. Teachers may also nominate students. The following attributes are to be considered when choosing the winner: scholastic, athletic, citizenship/service, social. The winner is to be chosen by a committee from the names nominated. The Committee will include:

## DISTRICT SCHOLARSHIP

District Scholarships will be available this year, in the amount of \$1,000.00 each.

**PURPOSE:** To acknowledge excellence in fields other than academic.

\* To obtain a District Scholarship, eligible students must enroll in and attend a full program in a "bona fide" post secondary institution of their choice or training program approved by the Ministry of Labour no later than 18 months following their award.

### **SPECIFIC PROCEDURES AND RULES:**

Candidates must fulfill the following:

1. Sign up sheet will be available in April.
2. Present to the local Scholarship Committee a concentration of courses that are broadly career-oriented. These courses will be selected from other than the arts and science concentration. For example, they should be courses involving technology, those of a vocational nature, or those in the visual and performing arts.
3. Achieve an average letter grade over the Grade 12 year of at least C+, have completed graduation requirements and have obtained at least a pass in their final standing in the prescribed English 12 course.
4. Meet criteria determined by the local school district.
  - 4.1 Candidates display superior achievement in their chosen field(s) of learning.
  - 4.2 Candidates have maintained a good attendance record.
  - 4.3 Candidates have maintained acceptable work habits.
  - 4.4 Candidates can, on request, provide a letter of reference from a teacher in their chosen field of learning.
  - 4.5 Candidates must appear before the Scholarship Committee with a display of student work i.e. Woodworking, Dressmaking, Metalwork, art portfolio etc., or provide an example of student work, i.e. Drama, Music etc.

## PROVINCIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Provincial scholarships of \$1,000.00 are based on provincial examination results. The top twenty (20) students in the province will receive awards of \$2,500.00 each.

A student will win a \$1,000.00 Examinations Scholarship if he/she:

- Meets the basic eligibility requirements
- Achieves at least a “B” in English 12, Francais langue premiere 12, or English 12 First Peoples
- Achieves 86% or higher on each of his or her three best Grade 12 provincial exams (can include the English 12 provincial exam)
- Fulfills the graduation requirements of either the 1995 Graduation Program, the 2004 Graduation Program or the Adult Graduation Program.

A student will win a \$2,500.00 Examinations scholarship if he or she:

- qualifies to receive an award (above)
- ranks among the top twenty (20) scholarship students (based on his or her percentage score).

Any student who achieves a perfect score (100%) in each of three Grade 12 provincial exams will also be awarded an Academic Medal of Excellence.

When a student has two different percent scores for the same Grade 12 provincial exam, the higher percent score will be used. Scholarship scores do not have to be earned in one school year.

**Note: A student can receive both a Grade 12 Graduation Program Examinations Scholarship and a Dogwood District/Authority Award**

### REDEEMING A PROVINCIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Students who qualify for a provincial scholarship are mailed a scholarship voucher in August or September.

Scholarships must be **redeemed within 5 years** from September 30 of their graduating year, and before the expiry date of the voucher.

A voucher must be signed by an official of the institution or program to confirm that the student is enrolled in a full-time program in order to be redeemed.

Other awards are "Limited Application" which means that potential candidates are limited by criteria other than academic. Students should enquire about potential awards and scholarships by making direct contact with the Office of Awards at the institution of their choice. See counsellors with additional questions.

Students can accumulate a maximum of \$1000.00 in this program.

### **USING (REDEEMING) YOUR PASSPORT TO EDUCATION**

You have up to five (5) years from the time you leave grade 12 to use your Passport to Education credits. Passports are good at any post-secondary institution that is approved for Canada Student Loans by the Ministry of Advanced Education. To verify if an institution is approved, students can access the awards website at [www.bced.gov.bc.ca/awards](http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/awards) at the “Designated Post-Secondary School Search” link. To use your Passport to Education credits at a post-secondary institution in British Columbia, take your booklet and stamps with you when you pay your tuition. Your fees will be reduced by the amount of your award. Your name and the name of your secondary school should be written on the passport booklet.

If you are using your credits at a post-secondary institution outside of British Columbia, you must initially pay your own fees and then submit a document or letter from the institution which verifies proof of registration, and payment of fees. This information should be sent with your passport booklet and attached stamps, a redemption form and a letter giving your social insurance number and the address to which the cheque should be sent.
